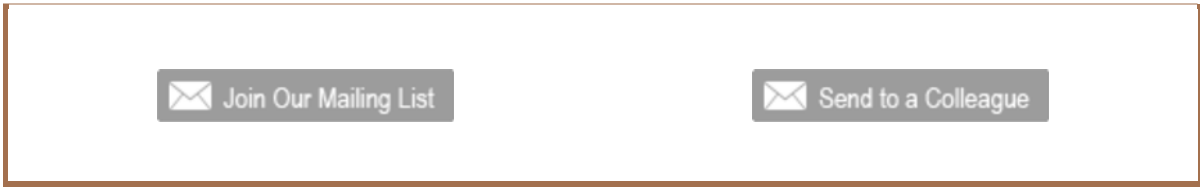

Since the inception of the PRIA standards, technology vendors have created software products and many recorders have extended this service to their constituents.

eRecording is a reality and new jurisdictions start every month. Some recorders have nearly 75 percent of their document volume submitted electronically. eRecording saves both the document submitter and the recorder precious time and financial resources.

Once again, recorders anticipated a need and worked together with industry partners to create a solution for all.
