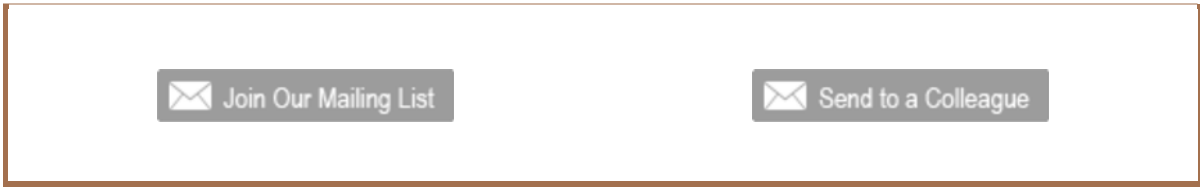
Plus, an added benefit is that these historic records are available to the public through remote access solutions recorders now offer.
